### **CENTRAL FLORIDA'S UNEMPLOYMENT RATE - DOWN 0.6 PERCENT** **FROM MARCH 2014**

Orlando, FL – The unemployment rate in the CareerSource Central Florida region (Lake, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, and Sumter counties) was 5.4 percent in April 2014. The region's jobless rate was down 1.4 percentage points from 6.8 percent a year ago and was 0.3 percentage point lower than the state rate of 5.7 percent. Out of a labor force of 1,229,388, there were 65,945 unemployed residents in the region.

- The unemployment rates in the CareerSource Central Florida region were: 5.8 percent in Lake County, 5.3 percent in Orange County, 6.1 percent in Osceola County, 4.9 percent in Seminole County, and 4.4 percent in Sumter County
- Nonagricultural employment in the Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford metro area (Lake, Orange, Osceola, and Seminole counties) was 1,106,900 in April 2014, an increase of 4.5 percent from year ago. This is the strongest annual job growth rate in the metro area since June 2006 when it was 4.7 percent. Statewide, employment was up 3.2 percent from April 2013 to April 2014.
- The metro area gained 47,200 jobs over the year with all major industries gaining jobs. Leisure and hospitality (+14,800 jobs) gained the most, followed by professional business services (+10,300 jobs); trade, transportation, and utilities (+9,900 jobs); mining, logging, and construction (+5,300 jobs); education and health services (+2,000 jobs); manufacturing (+1,500 jobs); financial activities (+1,200 jobs); government (+1,100 jobs); information (+600 jobs); and other services (+500 jobs).
- The metro area's over-the-year growth rates in leisure and hospitality (+6.8 percent); professional and business services (+5.9 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+5.0 percent); manufacturing (+4.0 percent); information (+2.5 percent); other services (+1.4 percent); and government (+0.9 percent) were stronger than the statewide growth rates in these industries.
- The Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford metro area led all metro areas in Florida in over-the-year gains in total nonagricultural jobs in April 2014. The Orlando metro area led the state in over-the-year gains in mining, logging, and construction; trade, transportation, and utilities; information; and leisure and hospitality. The metro area also ranked second in over-the-year job gains in manufacturing (behind Tampa-St Petersburg-Clearwater) and total government (behind Ft Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach).
