Summer Youth Overview and Outcomes Reviewed Summer Youth 2020 results (attachment) from the enrollment goals and activities with the Experience, Explore and Accelerate programs. Viewed a testimonial from a summer youth participant, who relayed the positive impact she experienced with the program.	



	 Guest Speaker Ms. Danielle Permenter with Orlando.org presented on "UpSkill Orlando" (attachment) – a grant initiative designed to increase awareness and the value of skills attainment by educating employers on: 1) their role to help upskill and 2) their return on investment with skill-based hiring. Review of Training Investment and Performance in a Pandemic Economy (attachment) Reviewed regional vs. state unemployment rate during COVID-19 pandemic vs previous months, which at 15.3%, is still above state and national rates. Reviewed career seekers served, and training & placement outcomes during COVID-19 pandemic vs. previous years. Discussed option to more broadly define investments from current six HGI sectors to rapid employment into the current COVID markets. 	Staff to do analysis of skills of laid off individuals and match, look for gaps to fill.
7	Other Business Ms. Coenen, COO, provided "Help Is Here" updates and explained the \$7M in CARES Act funds need to be expended by 12/31/20. She encouraged the Committee to refer any candidates who are Orange County residents or businesses to the CSCF website to start the process.



PY2021 - Number of Career Seekers in Training







Help is Here CARES Act Program - Orange County

- Program started Aug. 2020
- Outreach efforts have reached 74,500+ career seekers and 27,000 businesses
- 1,761 Orange County residents engaged in career services
- \$4.5M invested to support 765 residents with scholarships to attend training/educational classes or enroll in internship

Date: 11/19/2020

Purpose:

As part of the Career Services Committee charter, the committee reviews and evaluates recommended schools and Community Based Organizations seeking to become training providers aligned with defined targeted industries. This memorandum will provide a summary of those that applied during open enrollment and offer justification while none are being recommend at this time.

Background:

CareerSource Central Florida opens applications for new training providers to be considered for inclusion on the Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL) two times a year. A training provider on this list can receive payment through an Individual Training Account to provide training scholarships under the Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act. Applications are collected in October and April and brought to the CSC in November and May respectively.

October's list of applicants includes:

Summary

All three providers offer training in the targeted industries; however, each applicant is missing some required elements preventing a recommendation for inclusion on the Eligible Training Provider List at this time. Staff has communicated the specific items needed to each training institution and received positive feedback that they will be ready in April with complete applications for consideration.


