Currently, only 2% of semi-conductor industry of advanced manufacturing and packaging is done in United States.</li> <li>Central Florida Semi-Conductor Engine's success is primarily due to all the strong partnerships that have formed to include CSCF as workforce development partner, lead by Ms. Blanco.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
