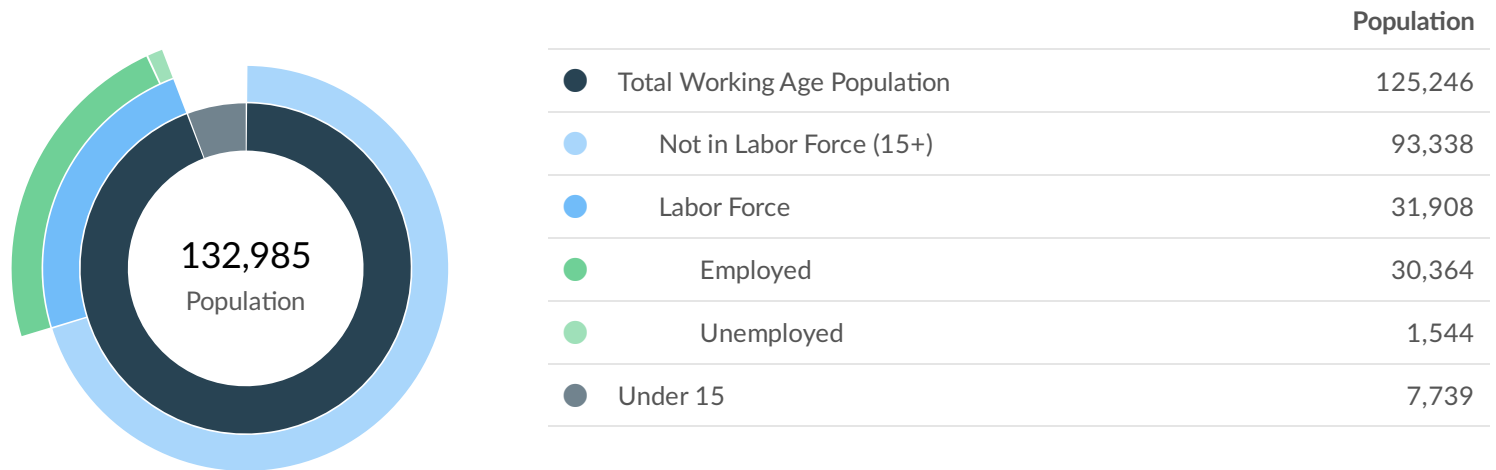
Median household income is **\$2.9K below** the national median household income of \$57.7K.

- From 2014 to 2019, jobs **increased by 20.1%** in Sumter County, FL from 27,900 to **33,498**. This change **outpaced the national growth rate of 6.9% by 13.2%**. As the number of jobs increased, the **labor force participation rate decreased from 26.9% to 25.5% between 2014 and 2019**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **17.2% of Sumter County, FL residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (1.6% below the national average), and **7.9% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.2% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2019 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Federal Government, Civilian, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.

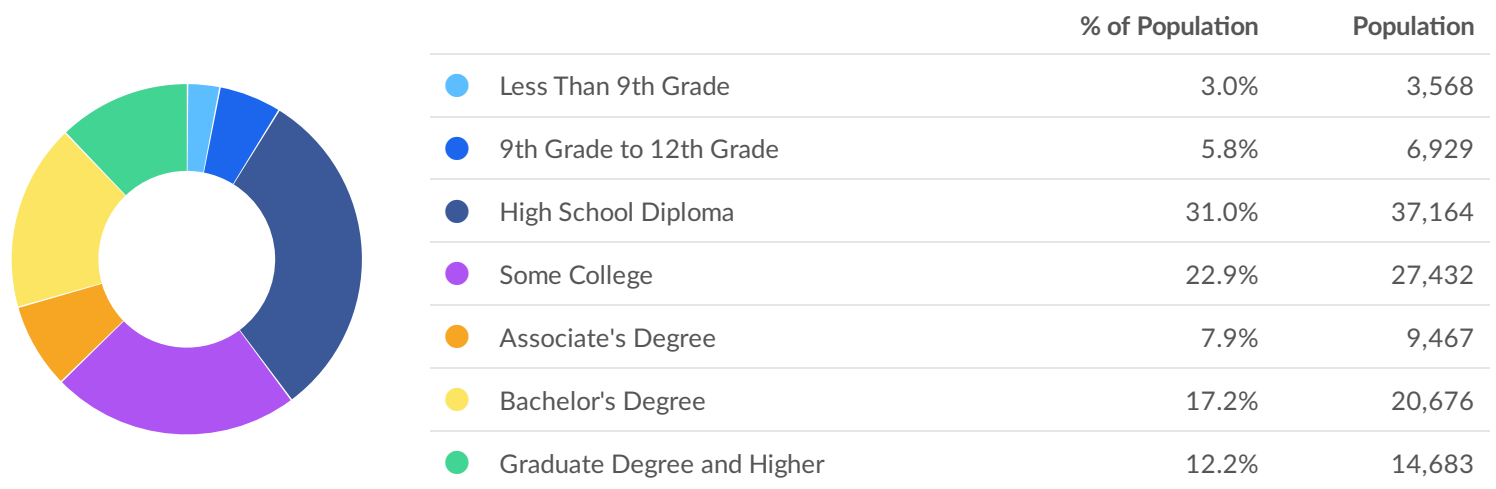

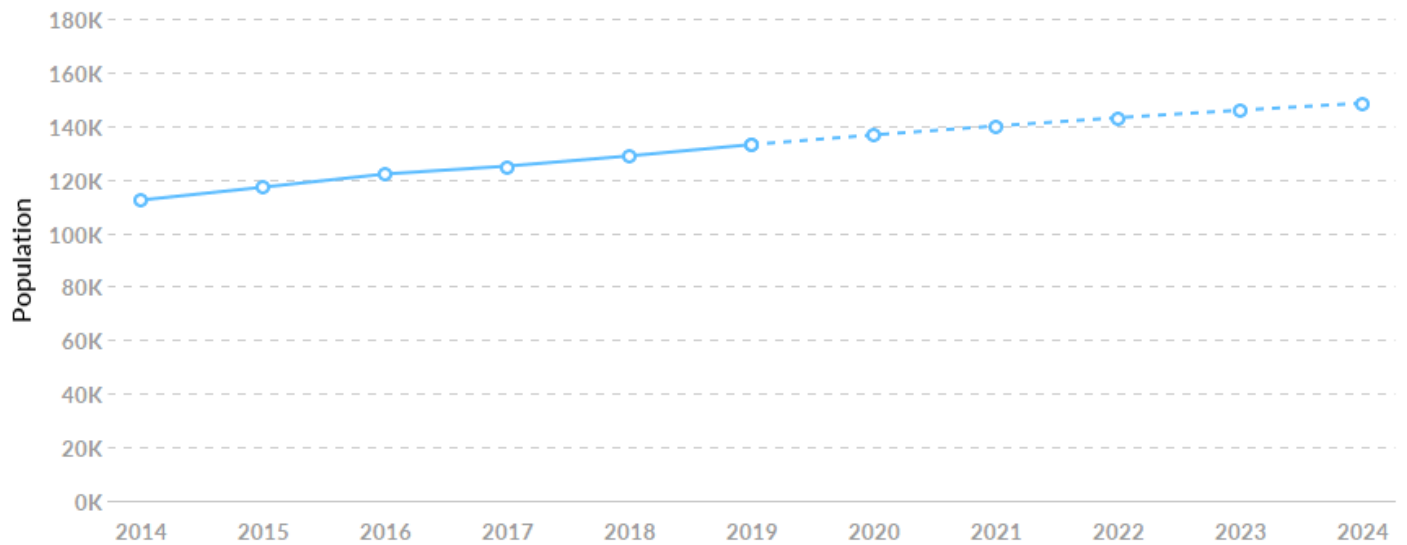

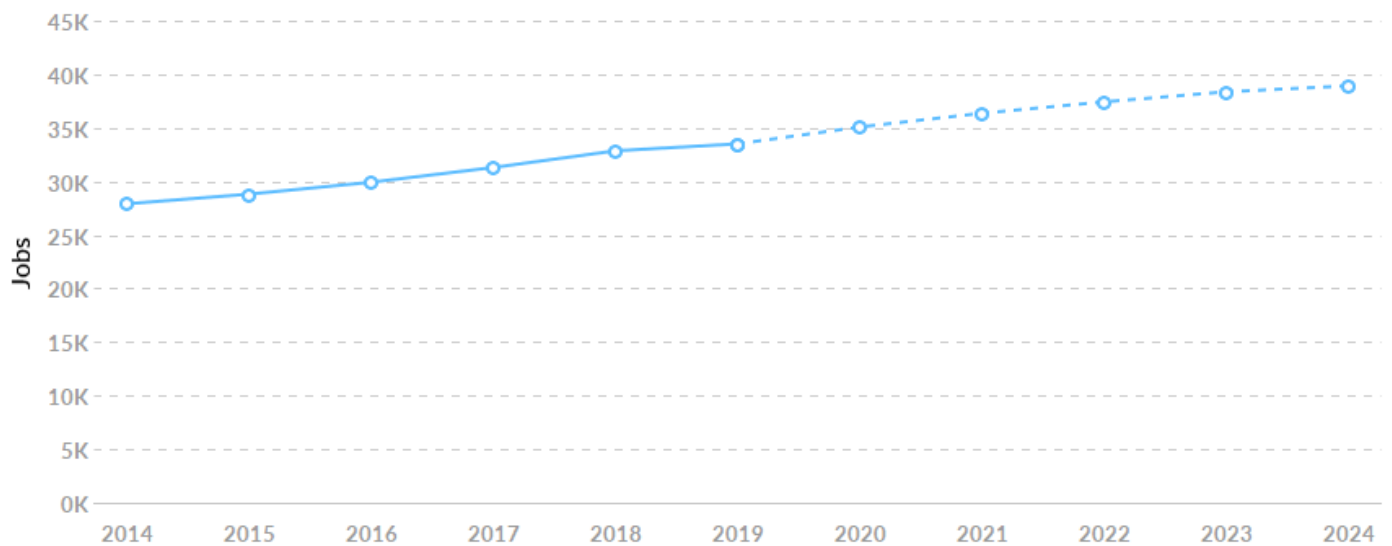

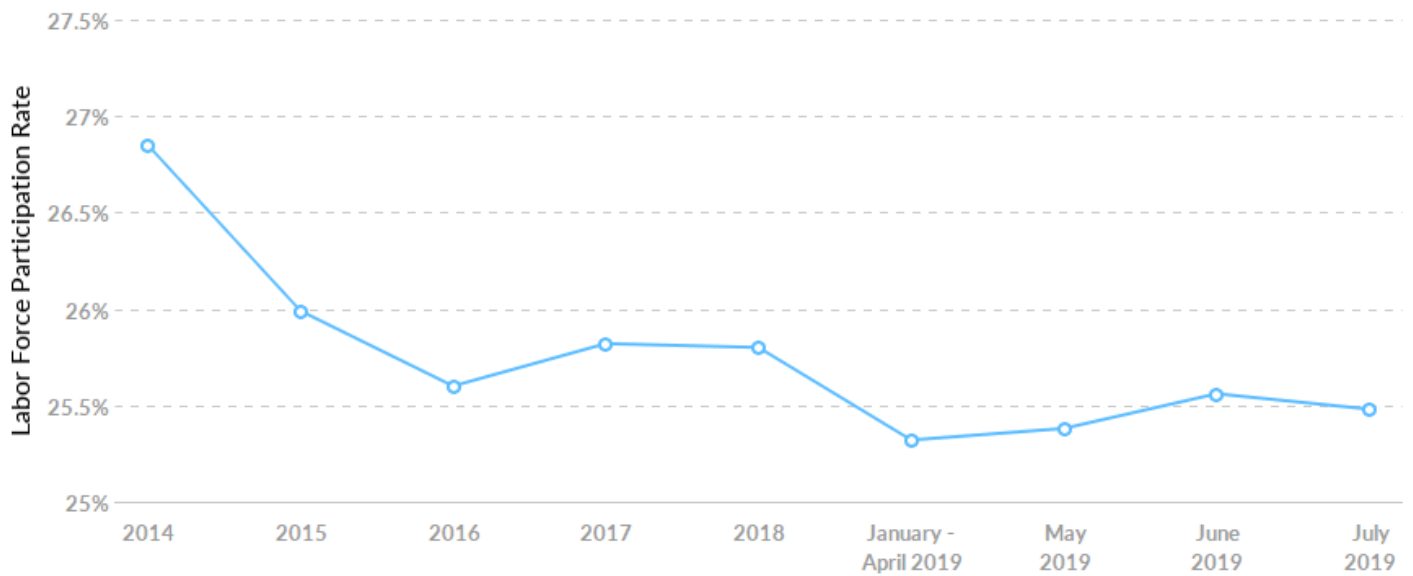
Job Trends

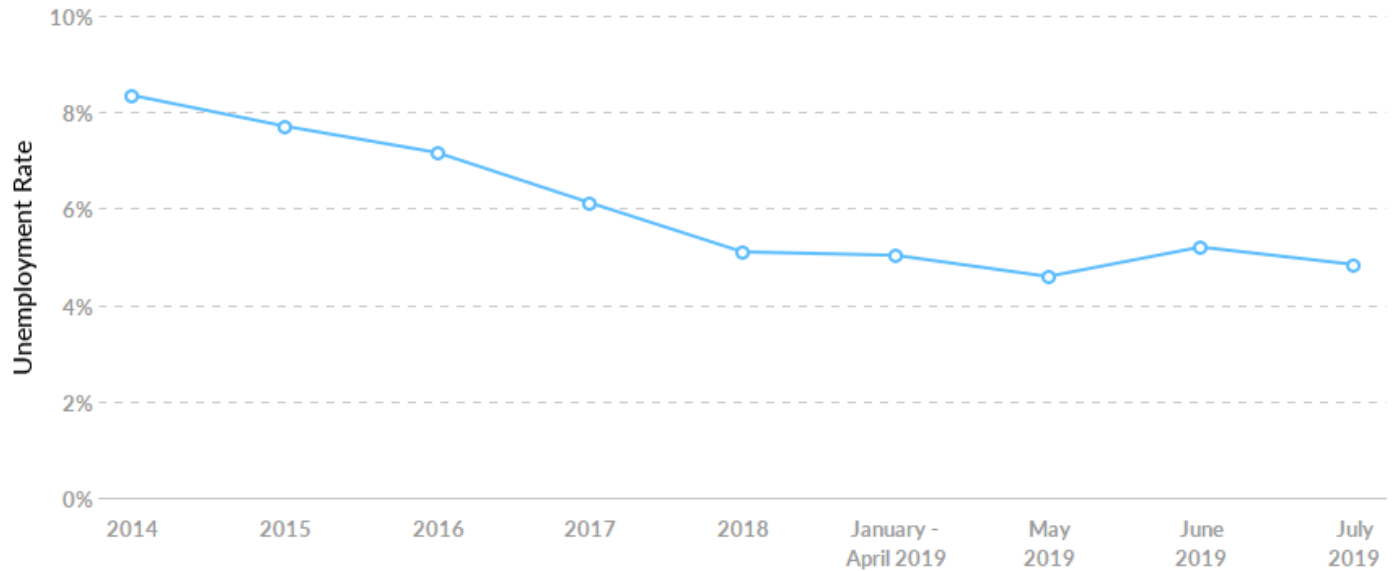

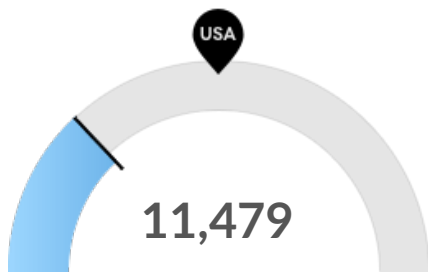
Unemployment Rate Trends

Sumter County, FL had a July 2019 unemployment rate of 4.84%, **decreasing from 8.35% 5 years before.**



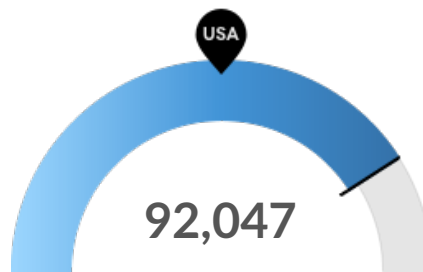

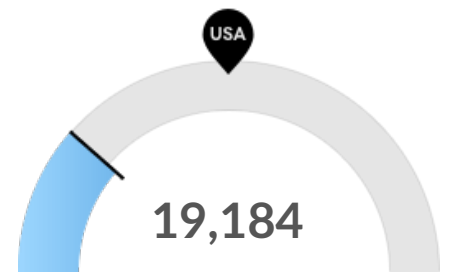
Millennials

Sumter County, FL has 11,479 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 26,470.



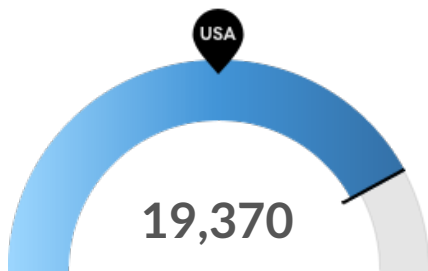
Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Sumter County, FL. The national average for an area this size is 37,270 people 55 or older, while there are 92,047 here.



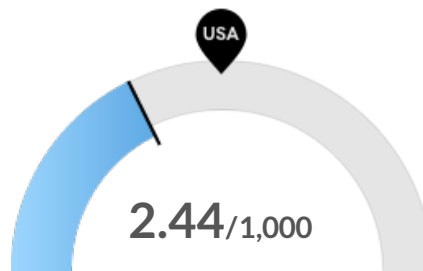
Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Sumter County, FL. The national average for an area this size is 51,011 racially diverse people, while there are 19,184 here.



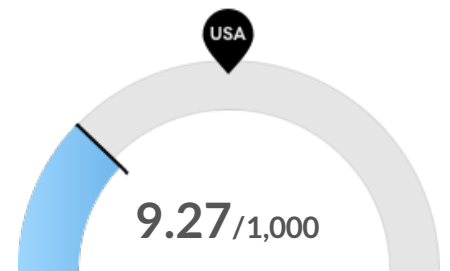
Veterans

Sumter County, FL has 2.44 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.87 per 1,000 people.

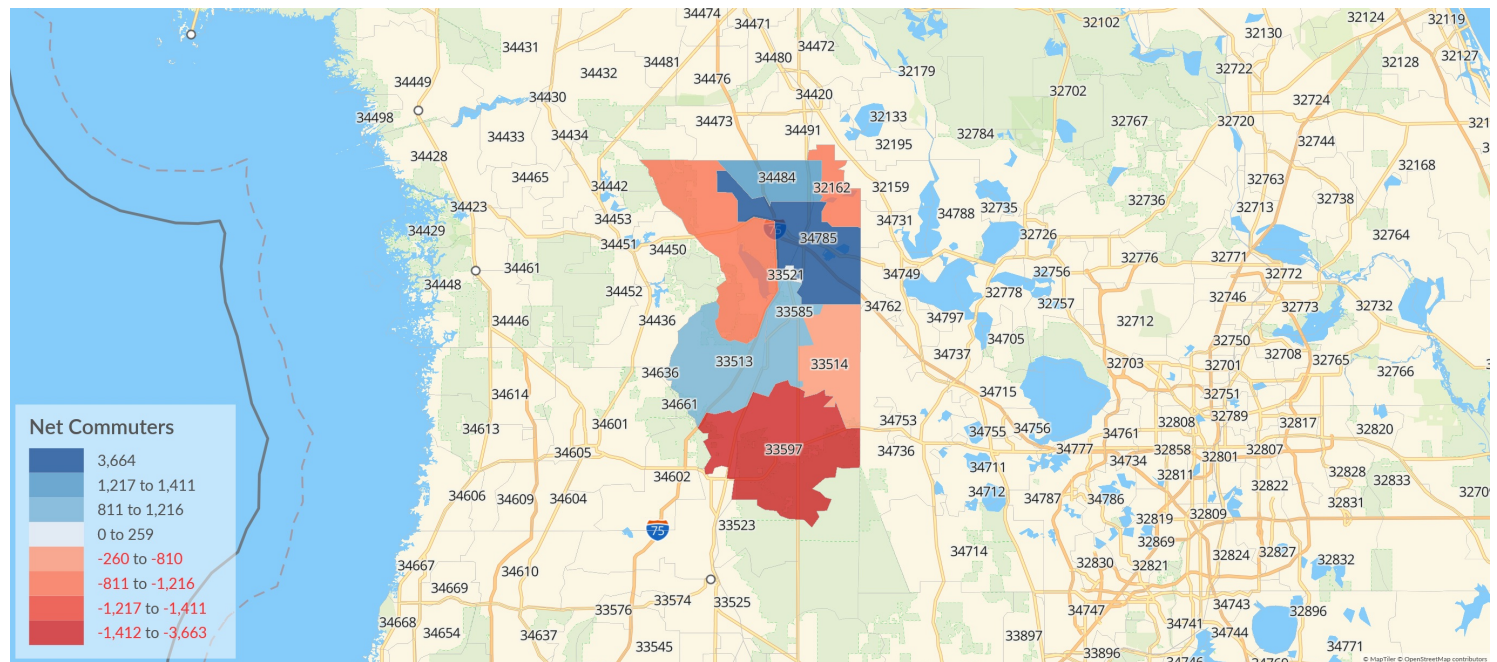


Property Crime

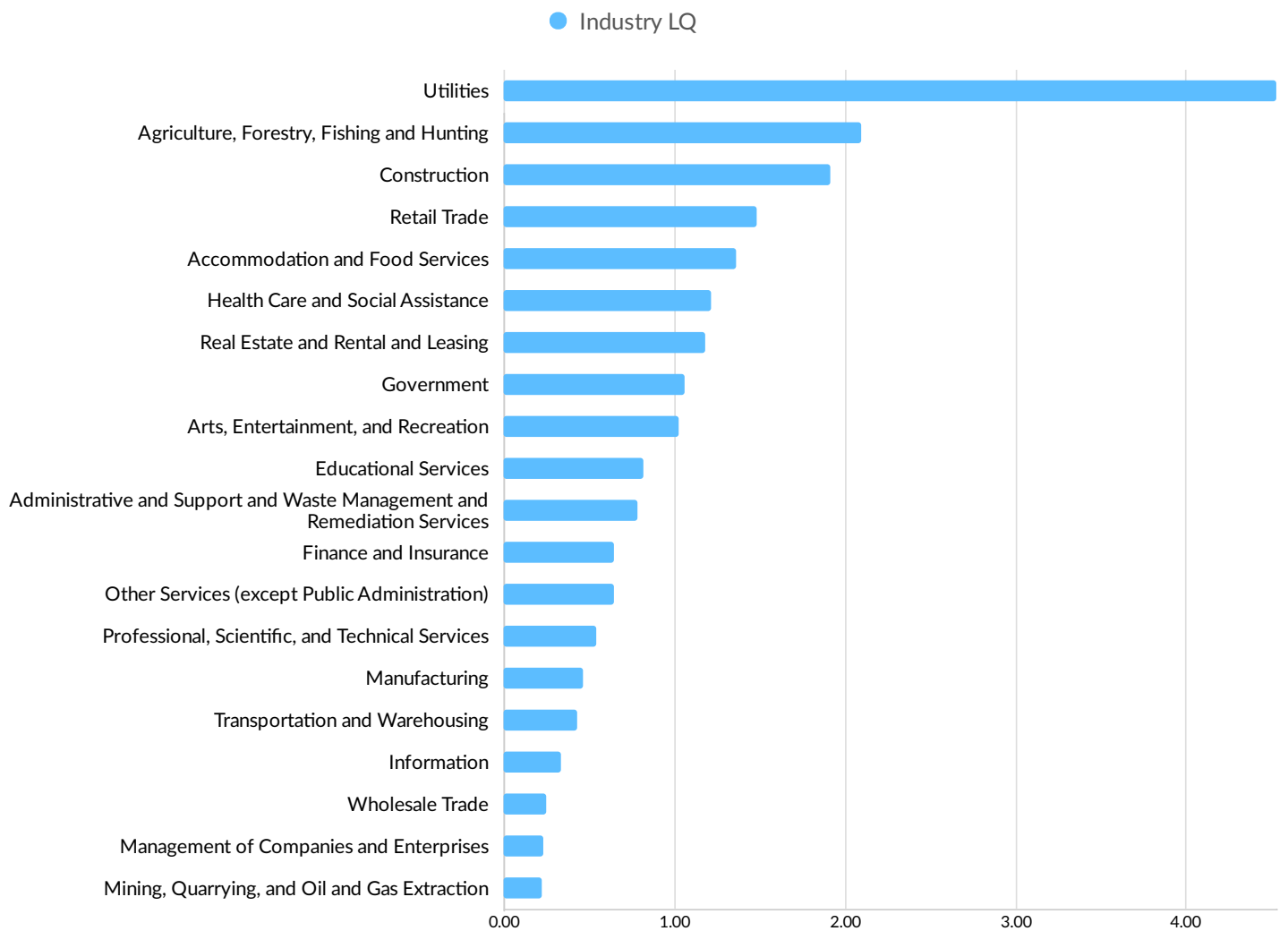

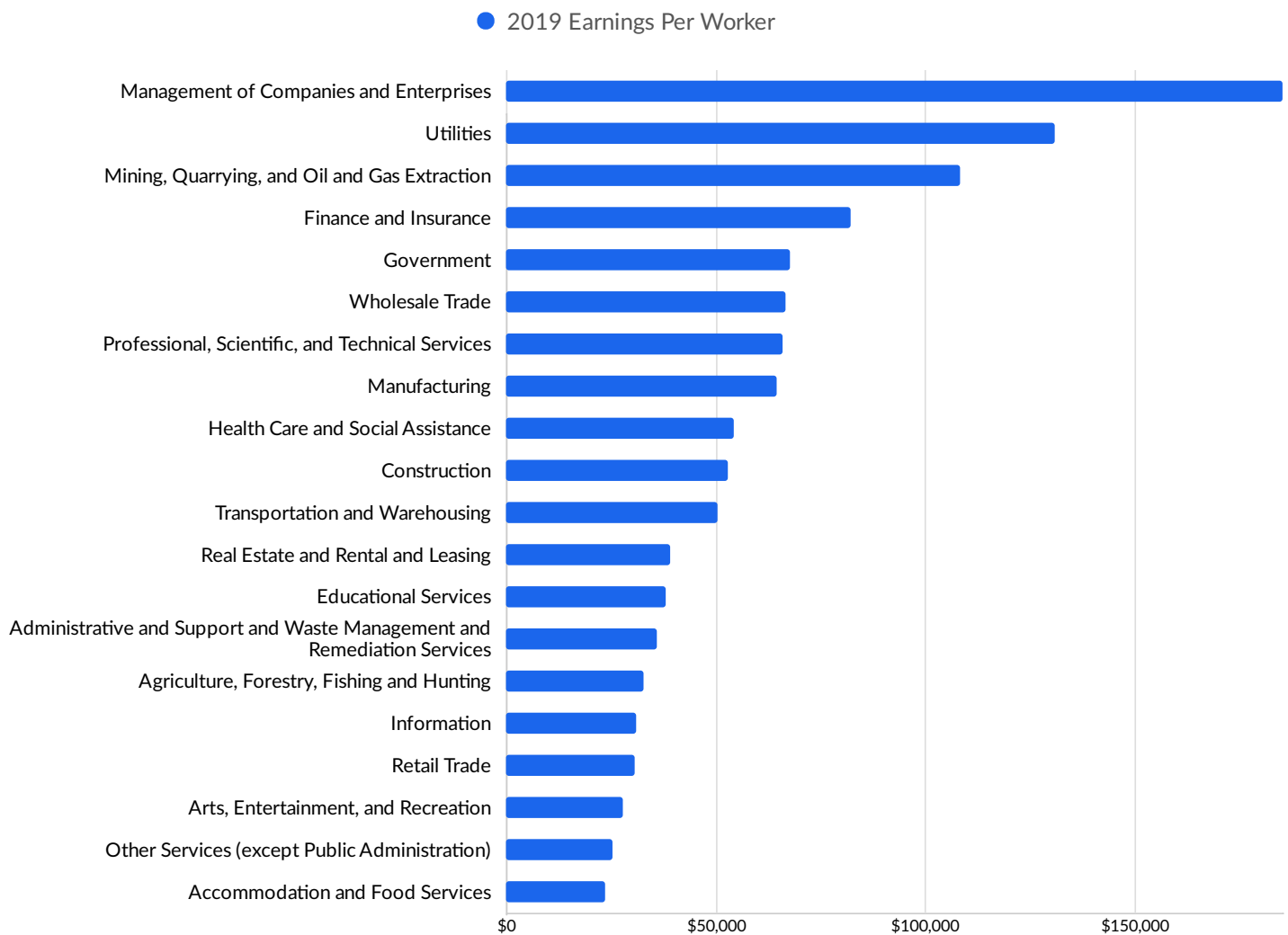

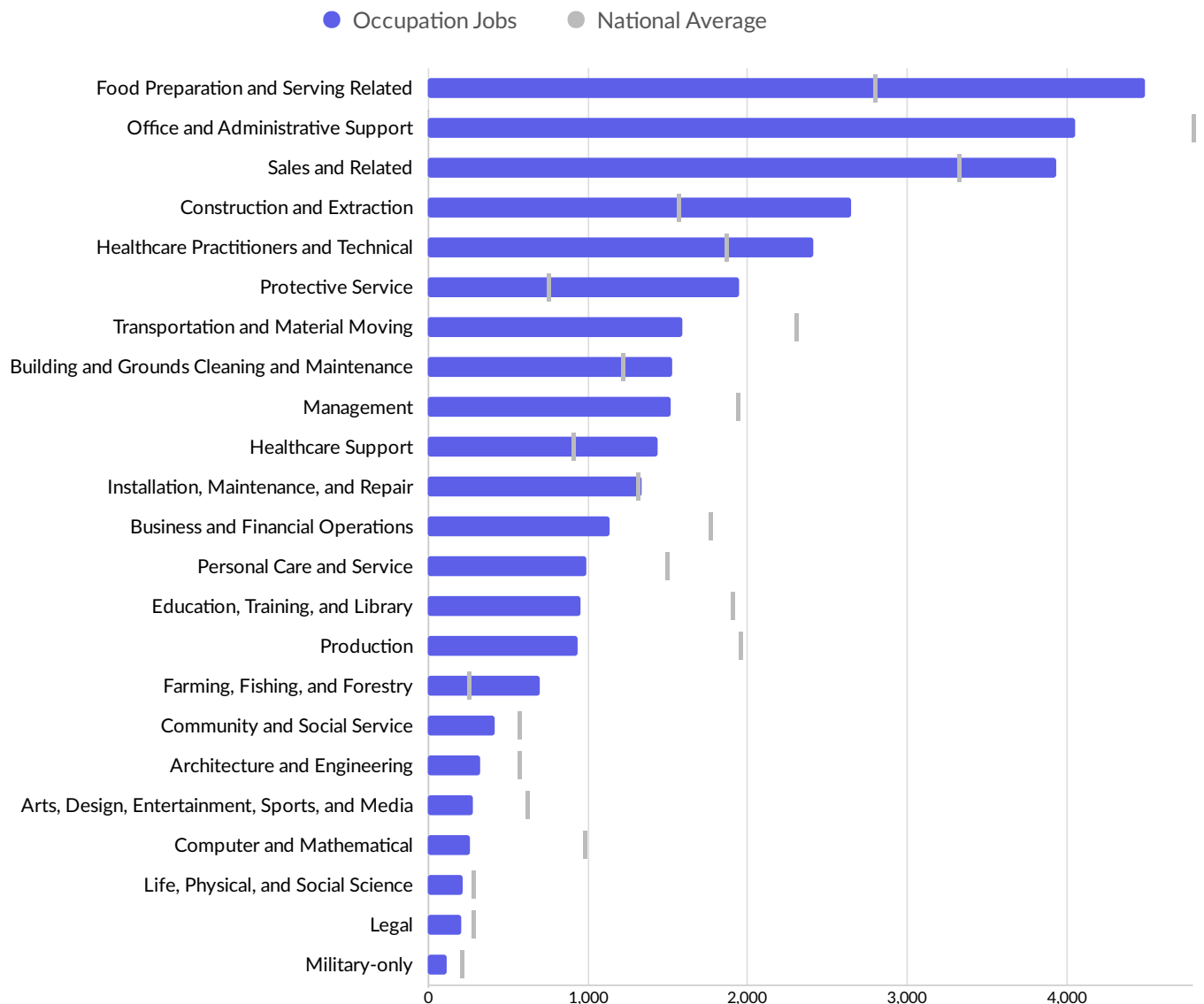

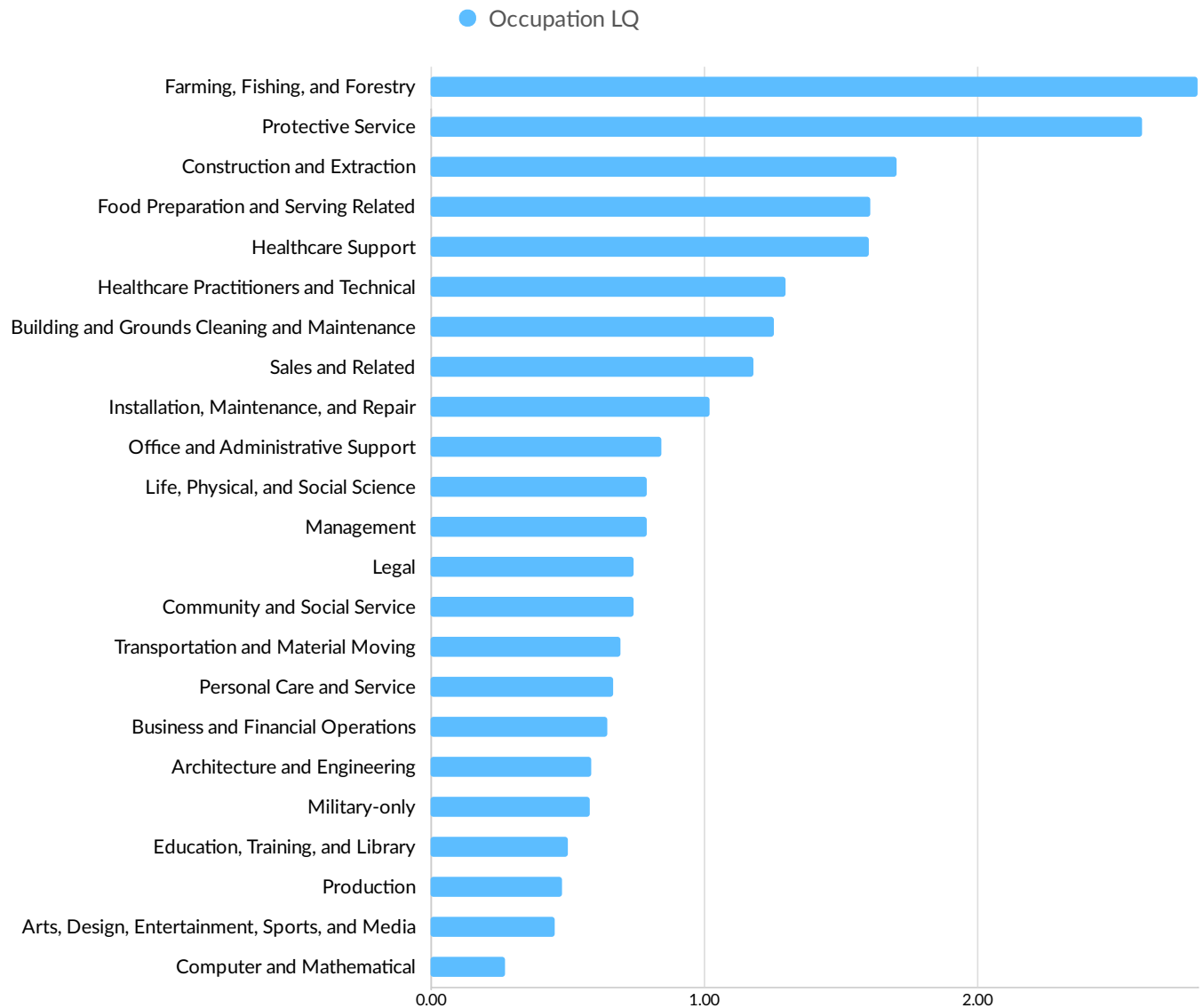

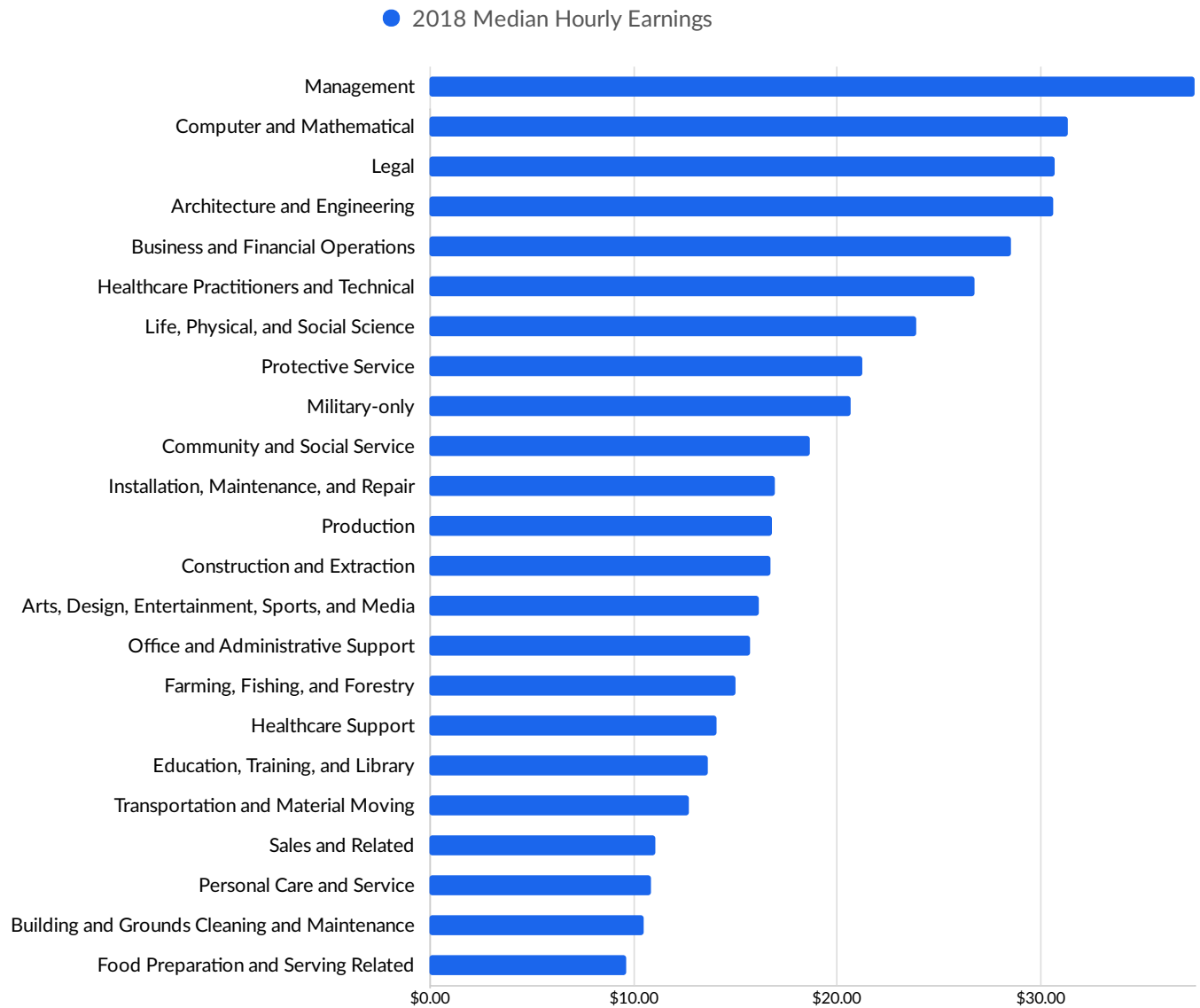

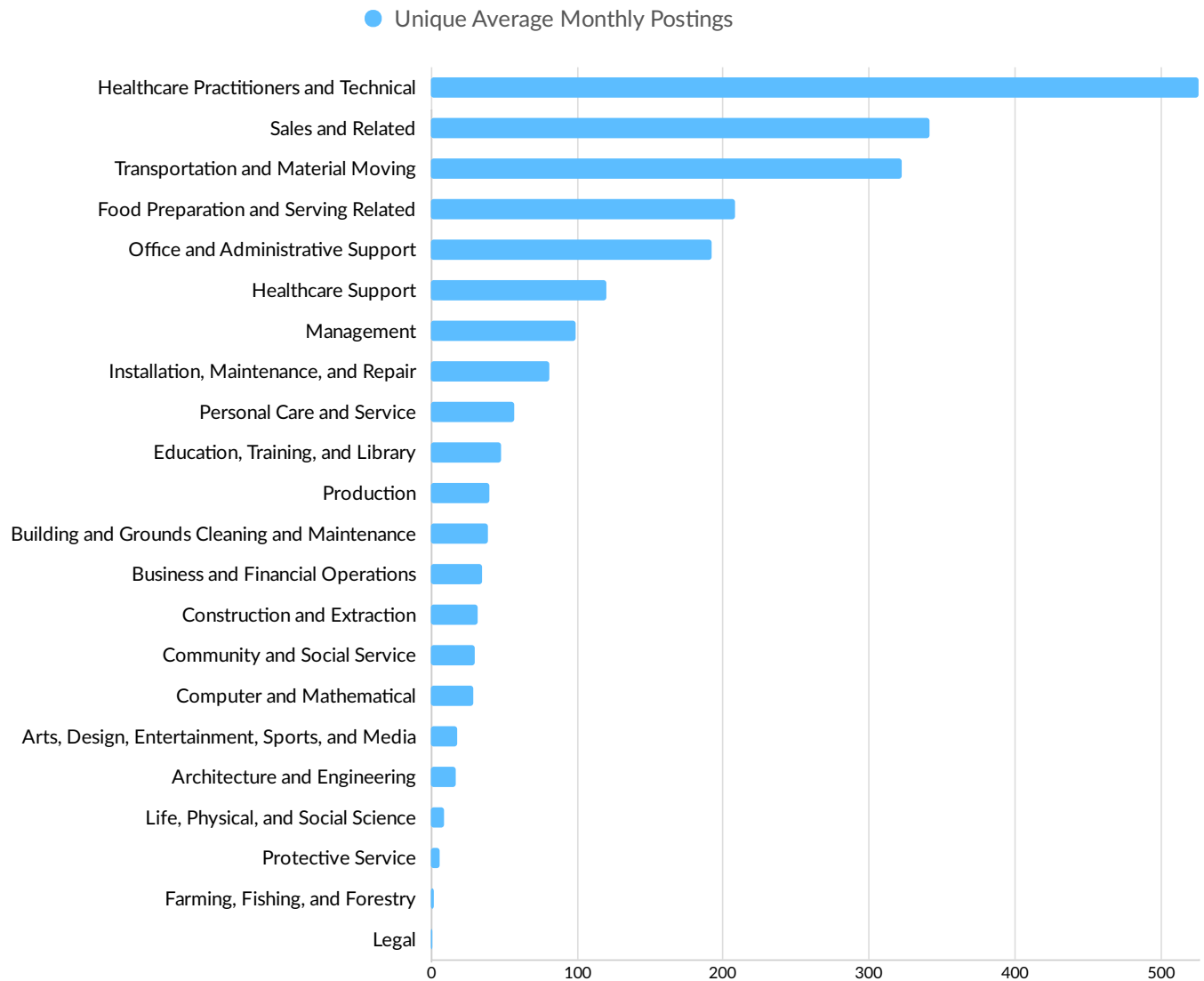

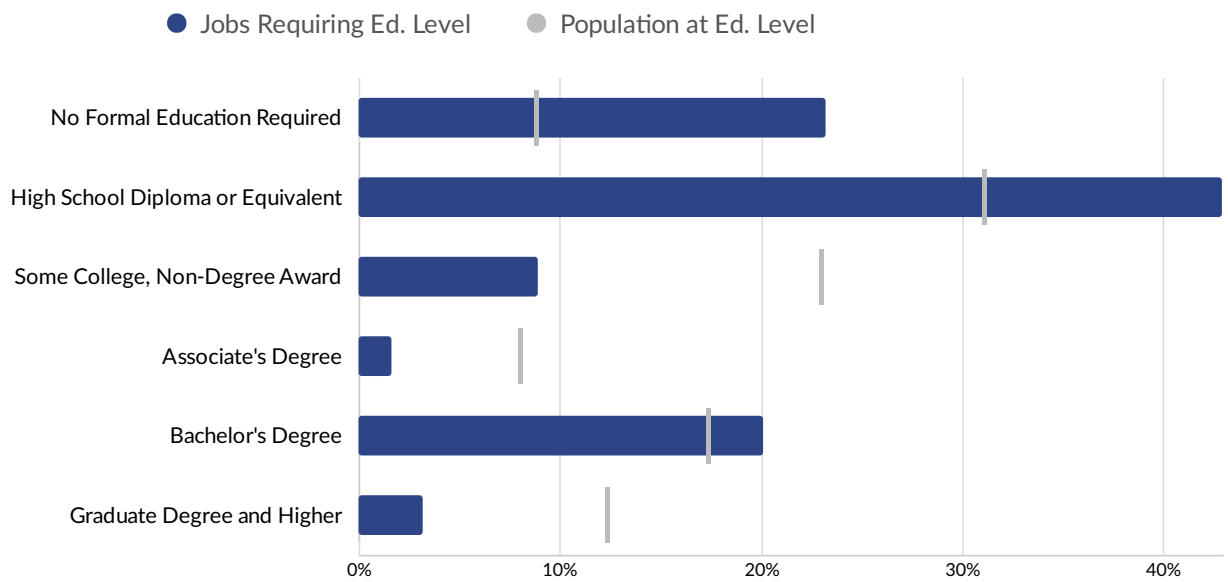
